

# Luke, The Gospel of – AK 11

These 2 additional questions, not found in the exam booklet are designed to make the student dig into the Biblical text and show they understand the Biblical principles studied throughout the course.

### **Questions 1 – What does the temptation of Jesus teach us about temptations? How did Jesus resist the temptations of the devil?**

#### **1 - POSSIBLE ANSWERS**

There are several observations and points that the author makes about temptation that a student may list. First, temptation itself is not a sin. Second, it teaches us that doing the will of God is more important than physical appetite. Additionally, in each temptation the end product is presented as justifying the sinful means of getting there. The end in each temptation was either morally neutral (eating) or good, but the means, which Satan suggested of getting there in each case, were not within God's will. The 3 temptations relate to *the lusts of the flesh, the lusts of the eyes, and the pride of life*. Jesus resisted temptations by using the Word of God in each case, specifically the book of Deuteronomy. Lastly, this story supports the claim in Hebrews that He was tempted in every way as we are yet without sin and that He is able to sympathize with our weaknesses.

### **Questions 2 – After His resurrection, Jesus repeatedly tells His disciples that the Law, the Prophets and the Psalms wrote about the Messiah's death and resurrection (Luke 24:25-27, 44-47). What passages of the Old Testament would Jesus have talked about?**
