These 2 additional questions, not found in the exam booklet are designed to make the student dig into the Biblical text and show they understand the Biblical principles studied throughout the course.

Questions 1 – In chapter 1, what is the key to successfully living the Christian Life?

Questions 2 – How does crucifixion relate to the *old man* in the life of a Christian (see chapter 6)?

2 - POSSIBLE ANSWERS

The “old man” in a believer is the sinful nature that is at enmity with God and righteousness; part of our nature is in opposition to and a hinderance to progress in the Christian life. The *old man* cannot be brought in submission it must be killed. Through baptism with Christ, believers are identified with Him in His death and burial. The old man has been crucified and the new man has been raised to new life with Christ by His Spirit. We are freed from the power of sin in our lives and are called to live in recognition of that freedom.

Misconceptions:

(1) The misconception that Christianity revolves around the church.

(2) Legalism: In this zealous misinterpretation of the Bible, rules are placed at the center of Christianity and all must revolve around certain practices of life.

(3) Emotionalism or the overemphasis on religious experience.

- [Gal. 2:20](#) I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me.

EXAM 3 – Which of the characteristics of Biblical Christianity discussed in this lesson most challenges you?

Characteristics of Biblical Christianity:

- Christianity Is Historical: It is not a myth or legend.
- Christianity Is Supernatural: It is not a result of human desire or natural law.
- Christianity Is Redemptive: It is not mere religious advice.
- Christianity Is Representative: It is more than a religious philosophy.
- Christianity Is Personal: It is not theoretical or abstract.
- Christianity Is Revelatory: It is not an ambiguous guess.
- Christianity Is Authoritative: It is not a compilation of subjective human opinion.
- Christianity Is Covenantal: It is not a powerless invitation of dubious promise.
- Christianity Is Exclusive: It is not merely the highest form of the human religious quest.
- Christianity Is Demanding: It is not a weak, sentimental, permissive avocation.
- Christianity Is Contemporaneous: It is not a specimen of an antique religious practice.
