MY PRISON GANG

“I want to thank you all for all the time and effort you give to us incarcerated. Now I want to share with you something that has happened in my life. All praise and glory go to our Lord and Savior! I believe that God sent His Son, Jesus Christ, to die on the cross for my sins. So, I lay my life at the foot of the cross and place my life, trust, and faith in Him. For a while, even though I would stay in the Word, do my Bible studies, and pray, I was falling short spiritually. My relationship with God was being hindered. It was frustrating.

“I started to fast, praying to God for guidance, strength, and courage to overcome. In Matthew 6:24 it says, ‘No one can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or else he will be loyal to the one and despise the other.’

“That’s where my problem was coming from. Even though I had given my life to Christ, I was still a part of my prison gang. I wasn’t giving Him my all. Our God is a jealous God! I knew what I had to do, but my heart was still loyal to my gang. I didn’t want to turn my back on my ‘homeboys.’ I didn’t want anyone to condemn or judge me. [Leaving a gang often means torture and death.]

“But when Jesus went on trial, men were spitting on Him, hitting Him in the face, mocking and beating Him. They drove nails through his hands and feet and crucified Him on the cross. (see next page)

"He then began to open up to me because he is broken, lost. I've been ministering and telling him about Jesus Christ. I told him I do Bible studies through the mail. I started praying. By the grace of God, he wants to do them. God is good!" **Frank**
