

National Volunteer Week, April 15 – 21

*There are 62.6 million volunteers giving their time to nonprofit organizations.

*Volunteers spend an average of 50 hours per year donating their time.

*Volunteers are 66% more likely to donate financially to the organization they volunteer for.

And Write-Way got the best of the lot! We have more than 350 volunteers serving prisoners. 40 of them pass through the Garland office weekly.

Write-Way started with two volunteers in the Fall of 1982 – **Ralph and Dorothy Nichols**. Both labored until their deaths, Dorothy in 2007 and Ralph in 2010. Below is a list of early Branches still serving faithfully:

1983 Grace Hill and Branch 002. She went on to open two more Branches (058 and 059) and still serves in the office every Friday and teaches a class at Collin CJ every Thursday. Vicki Culberston joined her and then later took over BR058.

1984 Stan Boyer and Branch 003. He designed a grading application that is still in use in prison ministries across the country. And he still sings with *Grandmas' Boyfriends Quartet!*

1986 Jim Williams and Branch 007. Jim originally started with BR002 and later formed his own Branch. He is also a Chaplain's volunteer, visiting inmates in Grayson CJ weekly.

1986 Bill Stevens and Branch 011. Founding Director was Harry Burks who served until his death in 2014.

1986 Paco Fernandez and Branch 014. This is a Spanish Branch counseling our Spanish speaking students. Paco has recently formed a second Spanish Branch 091.

1992 Richard Murray and Branch 017. Like several other English Branches, Richard and BR017 have added Spanish students because they have Spanish speaking counselors available in their congregation or a sister church.
